PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The ComEd® Energy Efficiency Program Compressed Air Fix It Now offering is available to eligible customers within the ComEd service territory. This offering helps customers identify and repair leaks, as well as other low-cost measures, in their compressed air systems to improve efficiency and reduce energy costs without adversely affecting facility or system operations.

Effective January 1, 2018, the ComEd Energy Efficiency Program will be responsible for verifying that an installing contractor is certified by the ICC for the installation of applicable measures prior to any incentive or rebate payout.

Beginning June 1, 2019, ComEd will be responsible for verifying that certified contractors are recertified with the ICC. Payment will be withheld if the installing contractor is not re-certified by June 1st each year. This does not apply to customers who choose to self-install the applicable measure(s). COMPRESSED AIR FIX IT NOW REQUIREMENTS

January 1, 2019 – December 31, 2019

REQUIREMENTS

1. Leak surveys must be performed at the customer’s facility by a **service provider** or participating contractor.
2. Leak detection must be done using an ultrasonic leak detector.
3. Leak identification:
 - i) If leaks are not to be tagged or are repaired at the time of the survey:
 - a) Provide a photo of the decibel reading at the leak location before and after the repair.
 - ii) If leaks are to be tagged:
 - a) Tags must remain in place at the leak location with a numbered tag that is clear and visible.
 - b) Tags must remain in place for at least 30 days after submission of the application.
This allows program representatives to verify leak repairs if necessary.
4. One leak must be repaired for every five horsepower of non-backup air compressors.
5. At least 50 percent of the total identified leak volume must be repaired in order to be eligible for the incentive.
6. All leaks must be repaired if less than one leak per five horsepower of non-backup air compressors is identified.
7. If all leaks are required to be repaired, and an individual leak is determined to be irreparable or cost prohibitive to repair; the customer may submit a written explanation and may be allowed to opt out of repairing that leak.
8. Itemized and dated invoices must be submitted for the leak survey (showing contractor names, survey date and survey cost) and for leak repairs (showing contractor name if applicable, itemized repair list and cost).
8. Must submit completed leak survey report (Excel file) with all required information, including:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

January 1, 2019 – December 31, 2019

ComEd offers energy efficiency incentives through its Industrial Systems offerings under the ComEd Energy Efficiency Program. These offerings facilitate the implementation of cost-effective energy efficiency improvements for eligible non-residential commercial, industrial and public sector customers.

Funds are limited and subject to availability.

PROGRAM EFFECTIVE DATES

The ComEd Energy Efficiency Program incentives are offered until approved funds are exhausted or December 31 of each program year, whichever comes first. The effective dates of the program are January 1, 2019 - December 31, 2019.

PROGRAM AND PROJECT ELIGIBILITY

The ComEd Energy Efficiency Program offers incentives, technical services and whole-building solutions to help facilities use energy more efficiently. These incentives are available to all eligible non-residential, commercial, industrial and public sector customers within the ComEd service territory, who pay into the Energy Efficiency and Demand Response Adjustment (Rider EDA) and receive their electricity over ComEd wires, regardless of retail electric supplier.

Customers are eligible to apply for a compressed air leak repair incentive once per program year at a given facility.

Project requirements under the ComEd Energy Efficiency Program include the following:

- √ Implemented measures must result in a reduction in electric energy usage due to an improvement in system efficiency. All projects must meet the ComEd Energy Efficiency Program cost effectiveness requirements.
- √ Measures must be installed and operational. Any measures installed at a facility must be sustainable and provide 100 percent of the energy benefits as stated in the application for a period of five years or for the life of the product, whichever is less. If the customer ceases to be a delivery service customer of ComEd, or removes the equipment or systems at any time during the first five years after installation, the customer may be required to return a prorated amount of incentive funds to ComEd unless replacing equipment or systems with more energy-efficient measures.
- √ Projects that are NOT eligible for an incentive from the ComEd Energy Efficiency Program include the following:

- Fuel switching (e.g., electric to gas or gas to electric)
- On-site electricity generation
- Projects involving gas-driven equipment in place of electric equipment (such as a chiller)
- Projects focused primarily on power factor improvement
- Projects that involve peak-shifting (and not kWh savings)
- Renewables

INCENTIVE PAYMENT LIMITS

For the compressed air leak repairs, the total incentive paid cannot exceed 100 percent of combined eligible leak survey and repair costs. Contractor labor costs can be considered in the project cost. Internal customer labor costs cannot be included in the project cost.

For the Standard program, the total incentive paid cannot exceed 100 percent of the incremental measure cost and 50 percent of the total project cost. For the Custom program, the total incentive paid cannot exceed 100 percent of the incremental measure cost and 100 percent of the total project cost. The definition of incremental measure cost depends on whether the measure being installed is considered to be a replacement or a retrofit.

For replacement measures, the incremental measure cost is defined as the cost to purchase and install the energy-efficient equipment minus the cost to purchase and install similar equipment that would meet federal and local energy standards but not qualify for an incentive under this program. For retrofit measures, the incremental measure cost is simply the cost to purchase and install the qualifying measures. Contractor labor costs can be considered in the project cost. Internal customer labor costs cannot be included in the project cost.

APPLICATION REVIEW PROCESS

ComEd will review compressed air leak repair applications for eligibility and completeness. The application must be submitted within 60 days of project completion. Project documentation, including dated invoices for the leak survey and repairs, is required. The location or business name on the invoice must be consistent with the application information. The project invoice must provide sufficient detail to separate the project cost from the cost of other services, such as repairs and building code compliance. ComEd reserves the right to request additional supporting documentation as deemed necessary to ensure eligibility and verify that the expected energy savings will occur. All customer information will be held in confidence. Requested information could include

equipment purchase dates, installation dates, proof that the equipment is operational, manufacturer specifications, warranty information and proof of customer co-payment.

INSPECTIONS

ComEd reserves the right to inspect all projects to verify compliance with program rules and the accuracy of project documentation. This may include pre-installation and/or post-installation inspections, detailed lighting layout descriptions, metering, data collection, interviews and utility bill data analyses. The customer must allow access to project documents and the facility where the measures were installed for a period of five years after receipt of an incentive payment by ComEd.

EVALUATION, MEASUREMENT AND VERIFICATION

ComEd's energy efficiency programs are evaluated annually by an independent third-party evaluator, as required by law. The customer's completed project may be selected for evaluation. Depending on the nature of the project, evaluation may include measurement and verification (M&V), the process of monitoring, measuring and/or verifying data related to equipment operation and electrical consumption. Upon reasonable notice, the customer agrees to participate fully in the evaluation process by allowing access to the facility where the project took place and providing information and access to data required for M&V to the program's evaluator.

TAX LIABILITY

Incentives are taxable and, if more than \$600, will be reported to the IRS unless the customer provides acceptable proof that it is tax exempt. In any event, ComEd is not responsible for any taxes that may be imposed on your business as a result of your receipt of this incentive.

DISPUTES/GOVERNING LAW

This application shall be exclusively governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois. Any litigation between the parties shall be prosecuted only in the state or federal courts located in Cook County, Illinois.

TOXIC MATERIALS

Neither ComEd, nor its consultants and subcontractors, or the Service Providers shall have any responsibility for the discovery, presence, handling, removal disposal of or exposure to hazardous materials of any kind in connection with customer's facility, including without limitation, asbestos, asbestos products, PCBs, or other toxic substances.

LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY

The Customer shall independently evaluate any advice or suggestion offered by ComEd related to estimates of electricity savings or the cost and is solely responsible for the selection or implementation of Energy Conservation Measures (ECMs). **IN NO EVENT WILL ComEd, ITS CONSULTANTS AND SUBCONTRACTORS, OR THE TRADE ALLIES BE LIABLE FOR THE CUSTOMER'S FAILURE TO ACHIEVE A SPECIFIED AMOUNT OF ENERGY SAVINGS, THE OPERATION OF CUSTOMER'S FACILITIES, OR ANY INCIDENTAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES OF ANY KIND IN CONNECTION WITH THIS AGREEMENT OR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF ECMs.**

DISCLAIMER

ComEd, in its sole discretion, may change any of the terms and/or conditions of this program upon thirty (30) days written notice to customer and/or Service Provider.

ComEd does not guarantee the energy savings and does not make any warranties associated with the measures eligible for incentives under this program. ComEd has no obligations regarding and does not endorse or guarantee any claims, promises, work or equipment made, performed or furnished by any contractors or equipment vendors that sell or install energy efficiency measures.

The customer shall be entitled to the energy cost savings realized by the customer's company that result from the installation of the cost-effective energy efficiency measure at the customer's site. In consideration of the services provided by ComEd as part of this program, the customer agrees that ComEd is entitled to all of the various attributes, rights and benefits associated with the measures, including without limitation PJM products and all other attributes, credits or products associated therewith under any regional initiative or federal, state or local law, program or regulation or program, and customer waives, and agrees not to seek, any right to the same.
